#### CONSTITUTION OF THE NORTH CAROLINA SHELL CLUB Revised October 21, 1961

This club shall be called the North Carolina Shell Club.

Membership shall be open to any persons interested in the collection of shells or the study of Malacology. New members may be received by the consent of the club at any regular meeting. Annual dues for Adult Members shall be \$1.00, for Junior Members \$0.50. Junior membership shall include all individuals of grade school age or younger. Those members three or more years behind in their dues shall have their membership terminated after due notice.

The following officers shall be elected annually, by ballot on the first meeting of the year: President, Vice-president, Secretary-treasurer.

An executive committee shall consist of the above officers, the retiring president, and one member who shall be elected annually. It shall be the duty of the executive committee to arrange programs for the meetings and supervise the affairs of the club.

The constitution may be altered by a majority vote of the total membership at any regular meeting, but written notice shall be given for any proposed change.

#### HISTORY OF THE NORTH CAROLINA SHELL CLUB

"Last Saturday week, in the Board Room of the North Carolina State Museum, a new hobby club came into being . . . . " so wrote Charlotte Hilton Green in the Raleigh "News and Observer" column "Out of Doors in North Carolina" March 17, 1957. This was the first public announcement of the North Carolina Shell Club.

Mr. Harry Davis (Director of the North Carolina State Museum) wrote that for a number of years there had been an interest by shell collectors in enlarging the mollusk exhibits at the Museum. After enquiries and suggestions were made in 1956 by Rev. Scott Turner of Buies Creek and Dr. Max Rogers of High Point, Dr. Davis, having had much previous experience with the North Carolina Bird Club, suggested to Rev. Turner and to Dr. Rogers that the time may be right to form an organization of shell collectors. They agreed to do so and sent letters announcing an organizational meeting to known interested persons, museums, and Biology Departments of many North Carolina colleges. The first meeting was held March 9th, 1957 at 2:30 P. M. in the North Carolina State Museum in Raleigh. During this meeting, the reasons for such an organization were discussed, a name was decided upon, a simple constitution was formulated, and officers were elected. The following persons were in attendance: Miss Lila Bell, Raleigh; Mrs. Graham Bell, Fayetteville; Dr. M. R. Carriker, Chapel Hill; Miss Mary Rose Gooper, Fayetteville; Mr. Harry T. Davis, Raleigh; Mrs. Charlotte Hilton Green, Raleigh; Dr. Istvan Ferenezi, Raleigh; Dr. Charlotte Dawley, Greensboro; Mr. and Mrs. J. M. King, Holdens Beach; Mr. F. B. Meacham, Raleigh; Mr. Jimmy Moore, Cary; Mr. and Mrs. Hugh J. Porter, Morehead City; Mrs. G. T. Proffitt, Lillington; Dr. Max Rogers, High Point; Rev. and Mrs. G. Scott Turner, Buies Creek; Mr. James E. Wadsworth, Chapel Hill; the late Prof. E. M. Walker, Buies Creek; Dr. and Mrs. Seth Walton, Raleigh; the late Mr. Herman Weil, Goldsboro; Mrs. Bill Wilkenson, Raleigh; and Mr. and Mrs. Edward Wooten, Winston-Salem.

Since then the club has usually met four times a year. About half of the meetings have been weekend field trip type meetings, consisting of a Friday night social, a Saturday business meeting, and a Saturday organized field trip. Members have frequently stayed in an area till Sunday for additional collecting opportunities. Field trips have been held on Baldhead Island, Kure Beach, Lumbar River (for fissils), Nags Head, New Topsail Beach, Shackleford Banks, and Yaupon Beach. Inland meetings have been primarily Saturday afternoon affairs.

During the past year and a half, weekend meetings were held in Holdens Beach, the University of North Carolina"s Institute of Fisheries Research in Morehead City, and in Southport. The Holdens Beach meeting was with members from South Carolina"s "Grand Strand Shell Club" and besides the usual beach collecting included collecting in a few nearby South Carolina fossil pits. At Morehead City, the club chartered two shrimp boats for a collecting trip to Cape Lookout. In spite of rough seas, few of the 60+ on the trip got sea sick. The Southport meeting also had members of the "Grand Strand Shell Club" invited. Approximately 50 persons made the trip over to Baldhead Island.

Since its beginning, the programs of the club have been quite varied and have been dependent upon wishes of the club members. Programs have included talks on life-history studies of certain mollusks by well-known biologists, talks on collecting trips made to various parts of this country or world, talks on land snail and fossil collecting. This past year programs have included a book review by Misses Elizabeth Grady and Elizabeth Mathews; the following movies: "Molluska", "Mysteries of the Deep", "Coral Wonderland", and "Shellfishing in the Chesapeake"; shell exhibits; and a talk by Dr. R. L. Menzies on Duke University's new oceanographic program and on his research on Neopilina. Dr. Ferguson has continued his systematic workshops (illustrated to a great extent by specimens from his own fine collection) and has during the past year discussed the following groups: Pectinacea, Neritacea, Cocculmacea, Pteriacea, Isognomonidae, Pinnacea, Anomiacea, Ostreacea, Chclophoracea, Viviporacea, Littorinacea, Rissocicea, Ceritheacea, Trigoniacea, Unionacea, Sphaeriacea, Epitoniacea, and Eulimacea. Those winning a door prize during the past year were: Mrs. Mary Lou Horton, Miss Elizabeth Mathews and Mr. J. H. Juneycutt. Following programs, socializing, buying, and/or trading of shells took place.
