HOW DID WE GET A STATE SHELL?? NORTH CAROLINA SHELL CLUB BEULLETN, 1966

A STATE SHELL? BY PAUL JENNEWEIN (Condensed)

On May 28, 1965, the General Assembly enacted a bill establishing the Scotch Bonnet, Phalium granulatum, as the official seashell of the State of North Carolina. It became the first state in the nation to take the official step, although other states had considered such action.

Credit for initiating action goes to Mrs. Marilu Horton of Wilmington. Carl Withrow of Charlotte, president that year, thought it was an excellent idea. Paul Jennewein of Wrightsville Beach stuck his neck out. He contacted friends on the 1965 Legislature for a bill making the suggestion official.

Many shells were considered, but the winner was proposed by Mrs. R. C. McLean of Red Springs. The members of the club voted, and the Scotch bonnet was "IT".

Other people involved in this lengthy project were James E. Wadsworth of Chapel Hill, Charlotte Johnson of Raleigh actually went to see the Govenor, Govenor Moore, and Gov. Moore thought it was a good idea, and passed the word.

Finally, this was official, and North Carolina was the first to have an official "State Shell". Much more work went into this project, and many more people were involved in it.

FIELD TRIP FUN by James E. Wadsworth

For the most complete field trip planning, appoint many committee chairmen and place everyone on a committee. This not only ensures good attendance, but gives each one a job to do.

Transportation: Be certain that all pilots of transportation have the same destination and know how to get there. This will prevent such catastrophies as the car with the box lunches going across the wrong river—the result, some starving shell hunters. If you use symbols such as B. Y. O. L. be sure that everyone knows this means :bring your own lunch".

Garb & Gear: Contrary to public opinion, it is not wise to tell the sheller what to take along or what to wear. It's much better to give full sway to the light packer and the heavy packer. Some carry everything including the kitchen sink--usually a collapsible canvas bucket. Others carry only matches, but no cigarettes. At least one person will bring a First-Aid-Kit. Sunburn cream then is available for teh binkini wearer. An extra raincoate saves another light packer.

The new shellers soon learn that paper bags are not the best for "toting" shells. The heavy packer comes to the rescue with an extra plastic bag.

Don't oversee the new sheller too strictly. After his pockets and bags are filled with fragments of weathered shells, he will start discarding some of this excess weight and selecting better specimens. Then much later, when he has graduated from Conchology to Malachology, he will only take live shells.

Beware of the person who knows a short-cut. He was here years ago and knows a great shelling beach. What he doesn't know is that the lagoon has been drained and is now the middle of a large shopping center.

Watch out for the Beach Salter. Like salting a gold mine, he distributes some foreigh shells at random along the shore. Result for the amateur sheller--a fantastic new discovery. The experienced sheller soon suspects the truth.

It always helps to have at least one person who is neither a Conchologist nor a Malacologist, but an organizer whose main aim is the comfort and safety of the group. This realist sometimes prevents shellers from being marooned on low sandbars. Of course with a large group, you can expect to lose a few, but keep this number to a minimum. I wonder if those missing from our last trip are still on that Island?

Boats: When the journey includes boat travel, there are new and different problems. The unsung hero of each voyage on the trackless Ocean is the pilot. Too often, we overlook his talents not only in charting our correct course, but in his extensive knowledge of boats and the sea. He sees that life preservers are on board and possibly Dramamine tablets for some of us faint-hearted sailors. He checks carefully on his fuel so one one will need to hitchhike. One of the most skillful mariners of the N. C. Shell Club is Bryan Dixon of Durham. He not only knows how to handle boats, but he is also a boat builder. He never worries because he knows he can always call on "Admiral" Phoebe Meadows for assistance.

Shell Identification: Is is difficult to convince some shellers that it is not necessary to identify everything on the spot. As a matter of fact, if you ask four or five different persons, "What is it?", you might get three or four different answers. Again, the heavy packer can still settle any argument by pulling out his copy of Abbott's "North American Sea Shells." Good ole Tucker!
