





The weekend of the show is that before Thanksgiving. We are at the mercy of the schedule of the institution where the show is held, thus the yearly change of weekend.



On Shell Show Etiquette

Some of the shell show rules have been modified. Importantly, the shell club continues to attempt to reduce public suggestions which has occurred in the past. Though people who have made suggestions certainly have the best interest of the show in mind, the result has often been annoyance and hurt feelings to exhibitors, judges and the public. We are asking that any suggestions (or complaints) be directed in writing, to the NC Shell Club Board of Directors (they slate of officers is listed in this prospectus) and no other party. Appropriate action for future shows will be discussed at the next Board of Directors meeting. It is very important for the welfare of the show. We have many visitors attending the show. Feelings can be easily hurt through misinterpretation of suggestions or criticisms. People should speak well of the show, for instance its professionalism. It cannot be stressed enough how important this is. The North Carolina Shell Club Board of Directors is prepared to expel any person or persons from the show who do not adhere to these guide lines.

notes: NORTH CAROLINA SHELL SHOW 1997

The following features of entries will figure strongly to the judges.

- 1. Arrangement, attractiveness and originality
- 2. Accuracy of labeling and scientific facts.
- 3. Quality and choice of Specimens.

The "Best Shell In The Show" and "Best Self-Collected Shell In The Show" awards can be awarded to any shell, in any exhibit category in the show. They are an exception to rule # 2. Winners do not necessarily have to be entered in the single shell category. If the entrant wishes a self collected shell be considered for the latter of the two awards, be sure to make it clear on the label that it is self collected if the category it is entered in is not a "self collected" one. A shell that has won one of these awards in a previous North Carolina Shell Show does not qualify for either award.

Trophies will be awarded to individual categories 18, 19, and 20. Awarding one trophy to all three categories collectively in the past was confusing and difficult because of the disparity of each category.

"Scallop Dump Shells" is a category because some truly beautiful shells are found in these sources but locality is sketchy, at best, thus not in keeping with a mission of the show to promote thorough scientific documentation.

Set up will take place during regular Cape Fear Museum hours. The museum has a loading dock, rolling carts and a freight elevator for large loads. A passenger elevator is also available for carrying exhibits to the second floor exhibit area. The museum has an admission charge. North Carolina Shell Club members and shell show exhibitors will receive a weekend pass compliments of the museum.




