The Basics

Minimum Bid Increments

\$1 to \$50 = \$1

\$50 to \$100 = \$5

\$100 to \$300 = \$10

\$300 and up = \$25

For lots of estimated high dollar value we may begin bidding greater than \$1.

Science

In the instance where no collecting/source or data is included with the specimen I record it as “No Data.” It is followed by the general known range that it is from. While not useful for scientific study, the specimens remain attractive and desirable.

I have done my best to represent the shells accurately. There may be variation in color rendering and contrast. Computer screens may change the view of the catalog.

I try to note any defects observed. However, I am not infallible in spotting damage and or forgery via “shell doctoring.” I recommend attendance at the viewing prior to the auction to confirm what is communicate in the catalog.

What makes the auction possible?

The shell club is blessed by the generosity of many friends who provide donations of shells and related material that make the auctions possible.

This auction features a handful of special shells collected by the club’s newest Life Member, Bill Bennight. He documented the shells many years ago when he personally collected them from Okinawan and Florida waters. So why do you want this? There is not a single growth mend anywhere on the shell which is saying a lot for a species that shares the ocean with predatory crabs. It is a nice bi-colored shell. A shell to display on a shelf in your living room and not to worry about a bright day and or curious guests allowed to handle a shell that typically is off limits.

These shells get together sometime during late October thru late December (water temp. had to get below 73 degrees) to mate and presumably lay eggs (never found any egg cases). This activity occurs in the channel between Motobu Peninsula (west side of Central Okinawa) and the north end of Sesoko Island. This depth is approximately 100 meters offshore from Sesoko Island and about a half mile east of the bridge. If you had the right light angle you could track them down by following their slime trails. You usually found one trailing another with a gleam in its eye. Occasionally they would herd-up and you could go nuts looking for only the really nice ones. We also found Strombus latissimus herding-up during the same time period in about 35-40 feet.

Two (Shell) Cabinets

Gift of Vicky Wall

Painted wood

Dimensions 20.5" deep (front to back) x 15" wide by 24" tall.

8 drawers

Wood slides (see detail photograph at right)

Painted white (by the donor) over dark painted wood.

Drawers are about 1.75" deep with about 1" clearance between each drawer
